# 2022 Programs Announced by International Centre Board

#### **Laudato Si – June 12-18, 2022**

**Presenters:** Linda Buck, CSJ is a Sister of St. Joseph of Orange (CA) in the USA. She currently serves in the ministry of Initial Formation and is a psychotherapist and spiritual director. She is a frequent presenter in the areas of theology, spirituality and psychology. **Mary Rowell** is the vocations director of the Sisters of St. Joseph in Canada and a professor of theology at the University of Toronto.

#### The Prophetic Stance of Relationship: The Two Trinities as a Model of Dynamic Love – June 25-July 2, 2022

We will explore the prophetic nature of our call in the world today and learn how the dynamic love as expressed by the Two Trinities is a model of our call toward relationality in our wounded world. It is in this openness to relationship that we incarnate Triune Love and participate in the process of bringing God alive in the world.

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#### Listening to the Heartbeat of the Creator Retreat – August 2-9, 2022

We will explore the story of creation as revealed to us today, from the splendor of the universe to the interdependence and interconnection of all life on our planet. What are the Creator's deepest desires for us at this time? Where do we come from? Why are we here? What ought we do?

**Presenters: Sr. Bridget Pritchard, SSJA** lives in the UK. Formerly a biology teacher, she is presently on staff at Ty Croeso Spirituality Centre, where she leads days of prayer and retreat. Bridget works with parish and school groups introducing the new consciousness. **Sr. Henrietta Curran, SSJA**, lives in the U.K. A retired teacher, she is currently working in JPIC as Congregation Justice and Peace Leader. She has given many sessions on the above topics whilst working with JPIC Leaders from India, Africa and England. She represents SSJA on the Global Sisters of St Joseph Forum.

#### The Lace is Not Yet Finished – September 13-19, 2022

In each generation since, the Holy Spirit has awakened God's compassionate presence in the hearts of women to respond to the ever-changing needs of the people of God. In this program participants will get in touch with and claim once again the transformative power of this charism in our midst and into the future.

**Presenter: Sr. Jane Delisle, CSJ** is a Sister of St. Joseph from Orange, CA, USA. Jane has come to Le Puy-en-Velay many times with sisters and staff from the Orange Health Systems.

#### Mission Effectiveness: The Charism Alive in CSSJ Ministries – September 24-October 1, 2022

This program offers a pilgrimage for lay partners in mission and provides an immersion experience into the original spirit and global dimension of the charism and spiritual tradition of the Sisters of St. Joseph. ### Sisters of St. Joseph Around the World



ITALY – Sunday, July 4 was an historic day. At 6 p.m., the basilica of San Maurizio in Pinerolo-Turin, hosted a solemn Eucharistic celebration with the official ceremony of the merger of the congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Pinerolo with that of Chambéry.



**CANADA** – In 2017, all three congregations of the Canadian Federation of the Sisters of St. Joseph became a **Blue Community**, that is, one that protects water as a shared commons and human right. "As human beings we have a relationship with water as a sacred gift that sustains life," says Paul Baines, coordinator of the project. The Council of Canadians initiated the Blue Communities project, in which the sisters pledged to strive to:

- End the unnecessary use of bottled water on our premises, recognizing that earth's waters are not a commodity to be sold.
- Ensure clean drinking water and sanitation are available to all, as a human right. Globally 2 million people have contaminated water because of poverty and government mis-management.
- Promote publicly funded, owned and operated water and wastewater services.

USA – Sisters Mary Jo Curtsinger, Marianne Race, Mary Pung, Jackie Schmitz and Rita Ann Teichman volunteered with Catholic Charities Humanitarian Respite Center in McAllen, Texas last April. #### International Sisters of St. Joseph Pray for Peace and Healing in Our World

In the midst of the world's woes of ragging fires, torrential storms, hurricanes, earthquakes, aggression, and violence, for one quiet hour on Saturday, August 28 hundreds of Sisters of St. Joseph and Associates throughout the world settled into a period of reflection and prayer for the sake of our cherished earth and its peoples.

The international CSJ Chambéry Congregation designed and hosted the prayer hour using quotes from Pope Francis' encyclical *Fratelli tutti*. Readings and prayers were spoken in various languages: Italian, French, Portuguese, English, with music in those languages as well as being sung in Urdu. To focus our reflection the hour was divided into these topics cited in the encyclical: Social Friendship, Envisaging and Engendering an Open World, A Better Kind of Politics; A Heart Open to the World; Dialogue and Friendship in Society; Paths of Renewed Encounter; and Religions at the Service of the Our World. Each focus contained brief statements, prayer, and song.
